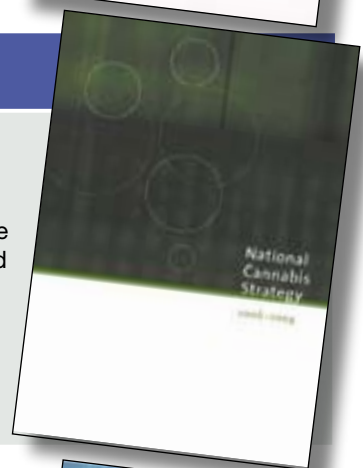

In November 2004, the Ministerial Council on Drug Strategy agreed to develop a National Cannabis Strategy and on 15 May 2006 endorsed the National Strategy, the first of its kind in Australia. The Strategy considers the health, psychological, legal and public health issues associated with cannabis use. The Strategy has been developed within the existing legislative framework and is consistent with a comprehensive approach to drug-related harm, involving a balance between demand reduction, supply reduction and harm reduction strategies. The Strategy provides a national framework for action to address the use of and harms associated with cannabis use.

A new five-year National Tobacco Strategy was endorsed by the Ministerial Council on Drug Strategy in November 2004. The directional approach of the new *National Tobacco Strategy 2004-2009* builds on existing tobacco control efforts and achievements by State and Territory Governments and the Australian Government. The National Tobacco Strategy is a long-term framework for national tobacco control activity under which all jurisdictions and the community may dedicate resources.

The *National Alcohol Strategy 2006-2009* was endorsed by the Ministerial Council on Drug Strategy (MCDS) in May 2006 and was developed through collaboration between Australian governments, non-government and industry partners and the broader community. It outlines priority areas for coordinated action to develop drinking cultures that support a reduction in alcohol-related harm in Australia. The four identified priority areas of the Strategy are: intoxication; public safety and amenity; health impacts and cultural place and availability.
